Teaching Language, Literacy and Content to the Diverse EL Populations

There is a diversity of ELs with a wide range of language and literacy skills and background knowledge – from Refugees to Long Term English Learners (LTEL). All need special linguistic and academic instruction if they are to succeed in middle and high school. In this session, Dr. Calderón will demonstrate key instructional features from the widely used program ExC-ELL that focuses on developing high levels of academic language, reading comprehension, and writing skills within each subject area. Ways to integrate language, literacy and content applies to K-12 classrooms. Examples for different grade levels and language proficiency of the ELs will be demonstrated and discussed. Features of whole-school success will be highlighted.
