Come to the **University of Arkansas, Fayetteville**
for a **tuition-paid*, one-year Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) degree**
beginning May 30, 2023.

Earn an **Arkansas teaching license, Grades 7-12.**
Receive generous **financial support through your first four years of teaching.**
Four applicants will be selected for the **NSF Noyce Teaching Fellowship.**

In addition to the M.A.T. coursework and teaching internship, Noyce Teaching Fellows will:

- Experience what 'authentic practice' means in the disciplines of science or mathematics, and how it can deepen your passion for teaching the subject you love
- Mentor secondary students to prepare a project for the Northwest Arkansas Regional Science & Engineering Fair (photos above), and create your own such project
- Receive a \$10,000 salary supplement* per year for your first four years of teaching in a high-need school district, with continued participation in the Noyce project: Teacher Enhancement of Agency and Authenticity in Mathematics and Science (TEAAMS)

*Receipt of Noyce scholarship and additional financial support is contingent upon your contractual agreement to teach in a high-need school district for four years following graduation.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Degree in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, or Math (awarded by May 2023)
- 3.0 GPA
- Experience with Science & Engineering Fairs, REUs or other research experiences in your discipline, or STEM-related academic clubs or organizations

Selection will also consider application and interview responses, passion for teaching, potential to engage all students in learning, and interest in making a difference in high-need school districts.

Application Deadline: December 9, 2022

Applications accepted after this date if openings remain.
