*Receipt of Noyce scholarship and additional financial support is contingent upon your contractual agreement to teach in a high-need school district for four years following graduation.

- Degree in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, or Math (awarded by May 2023)
- 3.0 GPA
- Experience with Science & Engineering Fairs, REUs or other research experiences in your discipline, or STEM-related academic clubs or organizations

Selection will also consider application and interview responses, passion for teaching, potential to engage all students in learning, and interest in making a difference in high-need school districts.
